# Tour of Ceramics China, late Spring 2008

We have been doing exchange programs since 1999. The "Ceramics China" tour is held twice a year: in early summer (economic) and in mid-October (with upgraded hotels). Our itinerary is based on the two most important ceramic areas: Jingdezhen-The Capital of Porcelain Ware since the Song Dynasty, and Yixing-

the Teapot Making Center of the World, plus three popular tourism cities: Beijing, Shanghai and Xi'an. We believe that these are the five most popular cities for a ceramic artist's first time in China. Each time, we made a little change for different scenery, such as Hangzhou, Suzhou, the Yellow Mountains and the Yangzi River/Three Gorges Cruz. During the tours, we travel from the modern cities with high rise buildings to historical ceramic villages. We visit ceramic art studios, factories, clay tools stores, museums and antique markets, plus some regular tourism sites, such as the Forbidden City, the Great Wall, and the Terra-cotta Warriors, and sometimes we also visit art schools, have a slides talk, and have hands-on clay programs with ceramic art faculty and students (optional, based on the schedule).

During the tours, you may also meet some Chinese national ceramic masters and/or have a banquet with high ranking government officers. Please visit our website for updated information at www.ChineseClayArt.com.
